We provide a private Facebook Support Group for 700 patients and their families to exchange experiences and to give and receive support.

Life Coach

We offered a Living With **ALK+ Lung Cancer Coaching** Service, providing 6-week online group sessions and also face-to-face coaching. Through self-management, individuals are empowered to regain control of their lives by understanding thoughts and emotions, strengthening mental resilience, identifying challenges, exploring different perspectives and setting goals.

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The six-week session has helped me accept my cancer more than I could have expected.



The course gave me the chance to speak with others in similar situations and has helped me to realise that I am not alone. The course provided me with the opportunity to share ideas and concerns and lean on the support of others in a secure space.



Trusted Information


The Patient Information Forum aim is to advance health by setting high standards for health information for the public and patients to use.

Advocacy

Early Diagnosis Campaign

In collaboration with EGFR Positive UK and the Ruth Strauss Foundation, we launch a national campaign aimed at raising the understanding of primary care health professionals of lung cancer amongst non-smokers.

ALK Positive UK

ALK-positive lung cancer is a relatively rare form of lung cancer caused by the abnormal rearrangement of the anaplastic lymphoma kinase gene. The vast majority of patients are non-smokers, about half are under 50 years of age when diagnosed (some are much younger), and the majority are female. Most patients are diagnosed at Stage 4.

Our Mission
